

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I see 2023 as a pivotable year for Beyond26. It was the first year in a facility that is barrier free and home to all our programming. Having everyone working in the same place builds synergy and friendships. Our document shredding program serves 24–28 jobseekers that volunteer Monday –Thursday from 9AM–2PM. Even though most of our B26 team is consistently in the community finding jobs for our jobseekers, having this home base is strengthening our team.

One of our initial goals for 2023 was to hire a part time job developer to begin working with some of our growing backlog of jobseekers. Instead, we hired a fulltime job developer in June. Erin Jones joined our team and after a short training period she hit the road and our community assisting our jobseekers find jobs in their own community. Between Nick Goodwin and Erin, they placed 54 jobseekers in 2023, our most ever in one year.

Our mission is simple: "finding jobs for adults with disABILITIES". In this quest throughout West Michigan, we are finding our jobseekers have a lot of ability. They are filling jobs that vary by skill set much like the general population. We have placed website designer, stocker, custodian, greeter, assembly worker, cashier, restaurant staff, sorter, tire technician, document shredder, barista, bakery, computer disassembly, receptionist and more. Beyond26's retention rate is 92%+ and some of our jobseekers are approaching their 5-

year employment anniversary. This grassroots organization is consistently gaining momentum and the community is finding us.

West Michigan is a special community that wholeheartedly accepts our jobseekers. We find more and more small businesses that offer jobs but also some of largest employers are excited to work with Beyond26. One such employer said in a recent meeting that they wished we had 15 jobseekers ready to join their organization. To that end, we continue!

If you are new to Beyond26, I want to encourage you to sign up to receive our newsletters and e-updates. In raising funds to meet our budget there are opportunities to support Beyond26. In 2023 we had our first annual Golf Outing at The Meadows at Grand Valley University. It was a great time, and our jobseekers were able to "putt for a fee" with our participants. It was a hit! This years Golf Outing is July 27, 2024, if you want to mark your calendars. Our annual fall Gala featured a work uniform fashion show, another favorite featuring our ever-capable jobseekers.

OUR MISSION

Aging out of Michigan's education system results in a critical time for individuals with disabilities. While the next step should likely be employment, unfortunately these opportunities are often few and far between. Beyond26 bridges this gap between local businesses and a community of excited and available jobseekers through networking and advocacy.

Our goal is to identify and overcome barriers to employment, and support our jobseekers as we work with them before, during, and after the employment process.

THE IMPACT

The theme of 2023 was growth. We hired an additional Job Developer to meet the demand of the community. In total, we placed 54 jobseekers in 2023, which brought our total number of jobseekers served to 192, which is a 30% increase from 2022. It was a great year for our jobseekers and our job placement team! We also had more business partner relationships start in 2023 than ever before.

On top of calling Beyond26 with open positions, J&H Family Stores supports our programs and community events financially. Businesses like J&H Family Stores are what make our work possible!






